What is Networking?

Networking is all about forming relationships that can support you in your career. It can be formal or informal, ranging from conversations at organised networking events, to meeting people on your course or at a student society.

It's important to network both online and "in real life" - this way you get the best results! When you meet someone at an event that you would like to have in your network, add them on LinkedIn and follow up with an email, asking to meet with them to talk further.

Use your networks! For example - connect with all of the other students on your course – you never know what Jim will be doing in three years. Maybe Sue will land a job with your dream employer – you can get in touch and have a 'stepping stone' to get into the company.

How to use networking in your job search

It is estimated that around 80% of jobs are not advertised. Instead, roles are filled through referral from professional contacts. One way to reach into this 'hidden jobs market' is to consider who you know that is currently working in your sector. Getting in touch, letting them know you are looking for work and asking if they know of any roles coming up is a great way to start. Most people will have an online presence, if you have chosen to or not. It's vitally important to ensure that your social networks show your 'best side' so you are ready for the moment when an employer decides to Google you before an interview.

There are two ways to approach this. Either 'lock-down' your profiles so that only friends can see your updates, or go through each account and make sure that you are projecting a professional image.

Based on a survey conducted by recruitment-views.com, 1 in 3 employers rejected candidates based on something they found out about them online and 68% of employers will find you on Facebook. Find out more about [managing your online reputation and using social networks for your job search](#).
