4. Present research findings in a professional manner for research reports and in American Psychological Association (APA) style.

**Summative assessment:** Qualitative research report – 3000 words.

**Weighting:** 100% of module grade.

**Title of study:** An exploration of undergraduate psychology students' identity formation during their first-year transition to higher education.

**Research question:** How do undergraduate psychology students form a student identity during their first year of higher education?

**Aim of the study:** The aim of the study is to explore how undergraduate psychology students form a student identity during their first year of higher education.

You will conduct this study during the module once you have been granted ethical approval to begin data collection. As part of this assessment, you are required to produce a 3000-word qualitative research report that is formatted and referenced in line with American Psychological Association (APA) 7th edition style conventions. You should aim to interview between 3-5 participants. The data should be analysed using reflexive thematic analysis (Braun & Clarke, 2006, 2012, 2014, 2019, 2020; Braun et al., 2017; Terry et al., 2017). Your final report should include:

- Title page.
- Abstract.
- Introduction (Literature review).
- Method.
- Results/Analysis.
- Discussion.
- Conclusion.
- References.
- Appendices.
