**Summary**

You must produce a scientific poster which outlines your dissertation research including a brief description of your work, a clear statement of the rationale (why this research is important), methods for data collection and data analysis, and a time plan summarising your planned timetable to completion.

**Details**

- 1) Please read the feedback provided via TurnItIn regarding your original scientific poster.
- 2) Then seek guidance from your supervisor OR the module tutor to help make sense of the feedback.
- 3) Please then make suitable amendments to the poster content in response to the feedback.
- 4) Add audio to the poster file (\*\* see box below which details how to add audio to ppt\*\*). The audio commentary should offer additional explanation to what is contained on the poster and should address the following key points – the main aim of the research; brief discussion of the key

underpinning literature; clear and detailed information about your methodological choices.

5) Save the poster and audio and submit to Turnitin by the deadline. **Do not convert to pdf.**

In addition to the learning outcomes specified above, you will be assessed on:

- The title, aims and objectives
- The theoretical underpinning of the dissertation project
- Justification of research methodology in relation to research aim
- Justification of method of data collection and suggested analysis
- Analysis of, and response to, the ethical and risk related aspects of the study
- A realistic time plan for completion of dissertation
- Poster construction (professional style and presentation of the information on the poster, including use of charts/diagrams/tables and images)
- Verbal explanation of the poster.

**NOTE:** You are strongly advised to contact the module leader (Nigel Smith) or your supervisor as early as possible to discuss your particular situation and clarify what this task means for you personally.
