Answer BOTH the following questions:-

Question 1

Explain the law of causation in relation to the law of tort and whether the law on causation achives justice for victims of harm and deters potential wrongdoers from causing harm.

Question 2

Bobby owns a sports centre called Tennis Land. For the fee of £25, customers are able to use a tennis serving machine to help them improve their return and volley. Normally, a red light shows above the machine immediately before it is ready to fire. Sandy, a keen tennis player, rushes forward to use the machine without waiting for Bobby's explanation about where to stand in relation to the machine. She also ignores his instructions to put on the safety goggles. Unfortunately, due to a failure to service the machine since its purchase, the red light fails to show and a tennis ball flies out of the machine at top speed without warning. Sandy is also standing much closer than she should be. The ball hits Sandy's eye and she is partially blinded. She is rushed to hospital where she needs extensive treatment, including the provision of a glass eye. She has been informed that the glass eye will need to be replaced every 10 years for the rest of her life.

Due to the incident, Sandy has to spend two months in hospital and consequently loses her job as a full-time in-house graphic designer. It is unclear if she will be able to get another job in the future.
Advise Sandy of what factors, (and how); the courts will take into account when assessing the amount of her compensation payment.

Assessment Criteria
Assessment Criteria

Knowledge – of the relevant law
Understanding & Application – of how the law is applied to facts or has any practical or policy implications
Analysis & Evaluation – consideration of alternatives, detailed meanings and strengths and weaknesses of relevant law, practice, policy etc.
Research – finding and using an appropriate range of relevant sources
Structure & Presentation – logical structure, clear language and presentation as required by the assessment format
