Assessment 2 - Oral Presentation

Learning Outcome 3:

3. Recognise and identify the factors which promote or restrict outdoor activity participation in contemporary settings

Task:

This assessment will require you to work in your travelling groups to prepare and deliver a 12-minute oral presentation. The main objective of the presentation is to provide us with a critical analysis of your journey to Shetland, considering factors which promoted or restricted how you participated in your journey. You need to consider contemporary concepts and setting. For example, ideas of slow adventure, micro adventures and climate-considered outdoor journeys, economics, environment, access/accessibility, social/political aspects and pandemics. Please link your own journey with critical analysis of the academic discourse in these wider fields of enquiry.

You may consider how these concepts applied to your journey. You may consider how you overcame these. You may consider what you gained from the experience. You may consider what you have learned from this for your future as an outdoor leader.
